### What is Universal Credit?

Universal Credit is a new twice monthly payment for people who are on a low income or out of work. It replaces a range of current benefits and Tax Credits.

Universal Credit will increase the financial benefits of work and provide your business with a more flexible workforce.

Universal Credit is based on earnings, and not on hours worked, offering more flexibility for staff to increase their hours or to take temporary or short term work.

Having access to a more flexible and responsive workforce can help your business with the challenges of filling vacancies.

Universal Credit payments automatically adjust each month based on the real time PAYE information you report to HMRC, so it's important that you report this information accurately and on time.

Employees getting Universal Credit will want to improve their circumstances, so you'll see them asking for more hours or for help with building their skills. Employers can play a role in this – helping your business become more productive.

Universal Credit was introduced for new claims across Northern Ireland from September 2017 to December 2018.
