

Eligibility for the **Covid Restrictions Business Support Scheme Part B** is linked to businesses in the direct supply chain of or reliant on a business named in the Health Protection Regulations. The Health Protection Regulations are published by the Department of Health. The Regulations are available in full – see the **[Health Protection \(Coronavirus, Restrictions\) \(No.2\) Regulations \(Northern Ireland\) 2020](#)**.

The table below provides a summary of the businesses named in the regulations that have had to close, cease trading or be restricted. This has been provided for ease of understanding, and it does not replace or supersede the regulations referenced above.
